SUBJECT: CHANGES TO THE DISASTER GUIDANCE ATTACHMENT – DISASTER SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM INCOME ELIGIBILITY STANDARDS AND ALLOTMENTS – EFFECTIVE **NOVEMBER 1, 2013**

This letter transmits information on the sunset of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). Under ARRA, the maximum allotments were raised by 13.6 percent of the June 2008 value of the Thrifty Food Plan (TFP) and provided that benefits could not decline below this level for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Disaster Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (D-SNAP) households, during the period of October 1, 2009 through October 31, 2013. However, as a result, of the sunset of ARRA, effective <u>November 1, 2013</u>, maximum allotments will decrease for D-SNAP households.

However, the D-SNAP net monthly income eligibility levels previously listed in All County Information Notice I-62-13 remain unchanged. The computation below shows how FNS computes the Disaster Gross Income limits for a one person household:

Maximum Monthly Net Income Limit for household size of one (100% of FPL)	+ \$958
Maximum Standard Income Deduction	+ \$152
Maximum Shelter Expense Deduction	+ \$478
Disaster Gross Income Limit	= \$1588

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The Disaster Guidance Attachment which provides the new allotment amounts for the period of <u>November 1, 2013 through September 30, 2014</u>, are attached at the end of this letter.
