This ACIN is to serve as an update to counties on certifying to full utilization of the CWS/CMS. In previous years, counties were to submit a letter of certification to the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) verifying full utilization of the CWS/CMS in order to receive Child Welfare Services (CWS) funding augmentation after the CWS Basic General Fund had been expended.

Effective immediately, the CDSS no longer requires counties to submit a letter certifying full utilization of the CWS/CMS following AB 118 (Chapter 40, Statutes of 2011) and ABX1 16 (Chapter 13, First Extraordinary Session, Statutes of 2011), which realigned funding from state to local governments.

California statute (SB370, Chapter 1294, Statutes of 1989 and reflected in the California Welfare and Institution Code 16501.5) mandated a single statewide-automated child welfare services information system. The state and counties continue to share accountability for compliance with federal requirements for the Adoption and Foster Care Analysis and Reporting System (AFCARS) and National Child Abuse and Neglect Data System (NCANDS), as evidenced by data entered into CWS/CMS pursuant to 45 CFR 1355.40-1355.57.
