STANDARDS AND ALLOTMENTS - EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2015

This letter informs counties that the United States Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) has issued the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2015 Disaster Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (D-SNAP) Income Eligibility Standards and Allotments for the period of October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2016.

The computation below shows how FNS computes the Disaster Gross Income limits for a one-person household:

Household Size	Inclusions	Allotments
One-person	Maximum Monthly Net Income Limit for household size of one (100% of FPL)	+ \$981
One-person	Maximum Standard Income Deduction	+ \$155
One-person	Maximum Shelter Expense Deduction	+ \$504
One-person	Disaster Gross Income Limit	= \$1640

Each Additional Member	+\$347	+\$146

<sup>1</sup> These figures include all necessary calculations. For example, for a 1-person household in the 48 States and DC, the maximum net monthly income = \$981; standard deduction = \$155; maximum shelter deduction = \$504. \$981 + \$155 + \$504 = \$1640.
