Reference is made to the above indicated lawsuit. Enclosed is a copy of the District Court's ORDER GRANTING TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER AND CERTIFYING CASE AS A CLASS ACTION.

Unless the current budget impasse is resolved by July 27, 1990, please note that the State of California will be in Federal District Court that date arguing its legal position that it does not have the authority to make such AFDC payments due to the fact that, among other things, there is no adopted budget.

Please note that said enclosed ORDER contains a ten day mailing written notice requirement for the termination or reduction of AFDC benefits. Accordingly, this communication is being sent to each of the State's county welfare directors.

You are hereby notified that if the State of California is successful at the July 27 hearing and the Temporary Restraining Order is dissolved, then pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code Section 11207 counties still remain responsible for making said full AFDC payments.

Plaintiffs having moved for a Temporary Restraining Order pursuant to Rule 65 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure and Class Certification pursuant to Rule 23 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, and the Court having considered said Motions, the Complaint, Memoranda of Points and Authorities, Declarations and Exhibits filed in Support thereof, and having heard the arguments of counsel and the Court finding that: (a) there is a substantial likelihood that plaintiffs will prevail on the merits of this action, (b) absent a Temporary Restraining Order, the individual plaintiffs and numerous other similarly situated recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent Children ("AFDC") in California will suffer immediate and irreparable harm as a result of defendants' suspension of all AFDC benefit payments pending enactment by the California State Legislature of a budget for the current fiscal year and defendants' termination of such AFDC benefits for some recipients without timely advance notice, and (c) this case satisfies the requirements for class certification under Rule 23 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this case shall be certified as a class action on behalf of all persons in California who are or will be eligible for assistance from the AFDC program from July 15, 1990 on, but who are not or will not be receiving the assistance due them in a timely manner because defendants are not disbursing the necessary funds to the counties for the AFDC program due to the current budget impasse.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that plaintiffs need not give notice of the pendency of this action pending a final judgment.

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FROM SACPAMENTO AG

Court on the merits of this action, defendants, their successors in office, agents, employees and assignees, and all persons acting in concert therewith: (a) shall refrain from withholding and cause to be promptly disbursed any and all AFDC benefits which are currently due or which become due to plaintiffs and members of the class at any time from the start of the current fiscal year; (b) shall refrain from withholding and cause to be promptly disbursed the federal and state monies necessary for the operation and administration of the AFDC program at any time from the start of the current fiscal year; and (c) shall refrain from terminating or reducing AFDC benefits without first mailing written notice of such adverse action to affected recipient at least ten days beforehand.

A hearing shall be held on plaintiffs' Motion for a Preliminary Injunction on Friday, July 27, 1990, at 11:00 a.m., in Courtroom 2. Defendants' Opposition to Plaintiffs' Motion shall be filed and served by the close of business on Thursday, July 19, 1990. Plaintiffs' Reply to Defendants' Opposition shall be filed and served by the close of business on Tuesday, July 24, 1990. No security shall be required for the entry of this Order.

Defendants may apply to the Court for modification or dissolution of this temporary restraining order on two court days notice by personal service or such other notice as the Court may allow.
