SUBJECT: JONES v. <u>YEUTTER</u>, et al. <u>Amended</u> Order - RDB #0491-17

REFERENCE: 63-503.232(c)(4)(A) and (B)

The purpose of this letter is to implement the Amended Order in the <u>Jones v. Yeutter</u> court case. On September 10, 1990, an Amended Order was signed which reflects the court's decision on the unresolved issues in the <u>Jones</u> v. <u>Yeutter</u> lawsuit.

The Amended Order requires that, for monthly reporting/ retrospectively budgeted (MRRB) Food Stamp households, additional/corrective Public Assistance (PA) payments that were not budgeted prospectively in a beginning month must be retrospectively budgeted (Manual Section 63-503.232(c)(4) and 63-503.232(c)(4)(A)).

The Amended Order also provides that Refugee Cash Assistance (RC) and Entrant Cash Assistance (ECA) are not to be considered as PA and any additional/corrective RCA/ECA payments are not subject to retrospective budgeting in Food Stamp MRRB households (Manual Section 63-503.232(c)(4)(B)). In order to continue the same budgeting procedures for CWD paid grants, the Department requested a waiver to allow the CWDs to continue to budget prospectively RCA/ECA payments. The Food and Nutrition Service approved the Department's waiver request on February 20, 1991. The waiver also requires the exclusion of all additional/corrective RCA/ECA payments from retrospective budgeting when those payments cannot be budgeted prospectively (Manual Section 63-503.232(c)(4)(B)).

The regulations implementing the Amended Order are effective December 1, 1991. Therefore, any additional/corrective PA payments that are not budgeted prospectively in a beginning month, beginning with December 1991, shall be budgeted retrospectively in the corresponding issuance month.
