SUBJECT: FOOD STAMP EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING (FSET) PROGRAM PLAN

UPDATE FOR FEDERAL FISCAL YEAR 1992

REFERENCE: MPP 63-407.842;

ALL-COUNTY LETTER NO. 39-64

The purpose of this letter is to provide you with FSET Program plan guidelines for Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 1992. The Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) is developing new rules for the FSET Program that would move the current performance standard measures (placements) to an outcome-based measure (see All-County Food Stamp Coordinator letter dated May 3, 1991). These rules are anticipated to be effective sometime in October 1992. Despite the potential changes in FFY 1992, FNS has requested that either a new one-year State Plan or a plan update be submitted in August. Because we anticipate that the State's FSET plan for FFY 1992 will need to be amended once the Federal rules are final, we are requiring Counties to only update their current FSET plan to cover FFY 1992 rather than submit a new FSET plan.

This table must be included if placements are expected to change from FFY 1991 levels or if contractors/cooperating agencies are expected to change.

B.a Geographic Exclusion Requesta

If your County is geographically excluded and plans to a continue in that status for FFY 1992, you must submit as request that includes any applicable updates to the onea submitted for FFY 1991. If you want to request as geographic exclusion or plan to begin operating a programa in FFY 1992, refer to All-County Letter No. 89-64 for a instructions. However, if 1992 will be your first year of operation, submit a one-year plan only.

C.a County Plan Amendmentsa

If you plan to make any substantive changes to your FSETa program for FFY 1992, you must submit a plan amendment.a Please note that the amendment(s) must be approved by FNSa before implementing the changes. You may be liable fora costs associated with the implementation of a requesteda amendment if implementation occurs prior to approval by FNS. The following are examples of changes that woulda require a formal amendment to your plan:a

- oa Major change in components (e.g., adding, deleting, ora reconfiguring workfare).a
- oa Change in the amount of expenditures expected to exceeda the 100 percent FSET grant level.a
- oa Change in the method of paying participanta reimbursement a
- oa Change in local program locations (offices).a

The plan amendment must include an explanation of the proposed changes(s) and incorporate those changes in the pertinent sections of year PSET plant. You should contact your oAIN and Employment Services Operations aureau analyst to Verify whether your proposal requires a plan amendment.

II.e Funding for the FSET Program

Your County should revise and/or update its FSET plan with an understanding that the State and County funding ratios, and amount of State General Fund available for the FSET program, are subject to change inethe final state budget.

The FNS has notified the SDSS that the State's 100 percent Federal allocation for the administrative cost of the program is \$7,566,497 for FFY 1992. The change in the State allocation amount is due to a new allocation formula for FSET funds (Public Law 101-624, Section 17€3). The new allocation is based on the number of work registrants in each State as a percentage of the number of work registrants nationwide. Attachment II reflects your County's estimated administrative share of the 100 percent Federal, and 50 percent Federal/25 percent State/25 percent County funding based on your County's percent to total of the statewide nonassistance food stamp caseload.

Final allocations will be issued when FNS approves the State Plan. The final allocation will be based on: (1) Counties' requests for funds, (2) State funds available for program costs in excess of 100 percent Federal amounts, and (3) FNS approval of the State Plan and budget. The "50 percent Federal/25 percent State/25 percent County" funds are estimated at \$1.6 million total. The State 25 percent share for program cost may be subject to reduction based on available funds. Program expenditures in excess of the 100 percent Federal allocation and the 50/25/25 allocation can be funded, at County option, with 50 percent Federal/50 percent County funds. All fund requests, particularly requests for additional administration funds at the 50 percent Federal expenditure level must be accurate and justifiable. end of FFY 1992, 100 percent Federal funds not claimed will be redistributed to offset 50 percent Federal/25 percent State/25 percent County expenditures based on the percentage of nonassistance food stamp recipients in each County.
