This applies to all adults in the home. |             |
| 2) | Will the WD's be available in other languages?   | At this time, there are no plans for that. Typically, regulations have<br>not been provided in other languages and the WD's are still<br>changing quite frequently.  |             |
| 3) | Do the families need to reprint if they were already printed in the adoption unit?   | No. The prints can transfer from the county adoption unit to the RFA unit. Since the prints are still within the county, they can be shared.   |             |
| 4) | What is the current status of Kim Wrigley's participation in the RFA program?  | Kim was promoted to Bureau Chief and will continue to oversee RFA at a higher level. Kendra promoted to RFA manager.   |             |
| 5) | How much information should be<br>discussed regarding the criminal history of<br>applicants and adults in the home?                    | A summary is all that is needed. Discretion should be used when determining what level of detail to include in the Written Report.   |             |
| 6) | Are there any changes being discussed<br>about the 90-day timeframe for approval of<br>emergency placements?                           | Not at this time. It is important to make the process as linear as possible, instead of breaking it into stages, which may increase the time to approval.  |             |
