This letter is to provide counties the CEC time study and claiming instructions for the Get Fresh Project, a new program within the CalFresh Nutrition Education program, which starts on October 1, 2013. The Get Fresh Project replaces two pilot projects, the County Welfare Department/Local Health Department Expansion for Community Nutrition Project (CFL 11/12-30) and the Innovative Ideas Project (CFL No. 11/12-42 and CFL No. 11/12-42E), which both end on September 30, 2013. The objective of the Get Fresh Project is to allow participating counties (see Attachment) the opportunity and funding to:

- 1. Implement community nutrition interventions and educate CalFresh-eligible participants on making healthier choices within their limited budget.
- 2. Develop successful and long-lasting partnerships between counties and nutrition education providers to promote the *2010 Dietary Guidelines for Americans*, increase fruit and vegetable consumption and increase physical activity among the CalFresh-eligible population.

3. Target areas with a high number of individuals who are at or below 130 percent of the Federal Poverty Level and may be eligible for CalFresh.

Nineteen (19) counties were chosen through a competitive Request for Application process based on their high number of CalFresh participants and their ability to establish a sound infrastructure with strong programmatic and fiscal oversight. Participating counties will reach their target audience using a combination of strategies such as nutrition education classes, community events, media publicity, advisory councils such as the County Nutrition Action Plans, promotion of health communities, as well as training and workshops.

Under current federal regulations included in 7 CFR 272.2, states have the option of providing nutrition education to SNAP-Ed eligible participants as part of their program operations. The funding for the Get Fresh Project was authorized by the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010, which modified the SNAP-Ed funding to 100 percent federal funds through two-year grants. Approximately \$7 million is available for the 19 selected California counties from October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2015, to fund the project. All Get Fresh Project plans must be approved by the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) and the United States Department of Agriculture/Food and Nutrition Service prior to implementation.

Time Study Instructions:

Effective with the December 2013 quarter, counties approved to participate in the Get Fresh Project will time study to Time Study Code (TSC) 3621.

TSC 3621 – CalFresh Nutrition Education-Get Fresh Allowable activities include but are not limited to conduct

Allowable activities include, but are not limited to, conducting activities that promote nutrition education and obesity prevention, local media outreach and program planning for evaluating neighborhood nutrition factors that will guide strategic and intensive nutrition education efforts with target neighborhood populations.
