This letter informs counties of the FY 2014-15 allocation for TCVAP related to the services, administration and child care costs. A total of \$10,575,000 GF, shown in Attachment I, has been made available based on the approved Budget Act of 2014.

In consultation with the County Welfare Directors Association, counties are held harmless to their FY 2013-14 allocation. As a reminder, counties have the flexibility to spend their allocations across program areas and activities if needed.

Funding for the TCVAP is provided for three categories of services: Administration, Child Care and Services. The Services section includes California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) services and TCVAP Social Services. Administration funds are for the TCVAP Cash Assistance program. CalWORKs Child Care funding covers both services and administration funds.

Claiming Instructions

Counties may claim administrative costs to Program Code (PC) 713 TCVAP Noncitizen Administrative activities and service costs to PC 714 TCVAP Noncitizen Services. Both PCs are 100 percent GF with no county share of cost. Expenditures that exceed the state allocation will be transferred to county-only share via State Use Only Code 715.
