SUBJECT: FISCAL YEAR 2016-17 COMMUNITY CARE LICENSING

ALLOCATION FOR FOSTER FAMILY HOMES AND ALLOCATION

FOR FAMILY CHILD CARE HOMES

This letter informs counties of the Fiscal Year 2016-17 allocations for the Community Care Licensing (CCL) – Foster Family Homes (FFH) and the CCL – Family Child Care Homes (FCCH) programs. A total of \$4,551,000 General Fund (GF) for FFH and \$37,000 for FCCH in both reimbursement funds and GF is available based on the Budget Act of 2016.

#### FFH Licensing and FFH Recruitment

Attachment I displays the total allocation of \$4,551,000 GF for FFH Licensing, which includes funding for *Gresher v. Anderson*, FFH Recruitment, Adam Walsh Protection and Safety Act of 2006 and Registered Sex Offender (RSO) Check activities. For those counties performing FFH Licensing activities, the funds were distributed based on each county's staffing costs, as follows:

- Each county's average monthly FFH caseload for calendar year 2015 as reported on the Licensing of Facilities for Children Monthly Statistical Report (LIC 181) was divided by the workload standard of 120 facilities per Full-Time Equivalent (FTE).
- This resulted in the number of justified staff required to license this facility category.
- 3. A worker to supervisor ratio of 6.25:1 was applied to this justified staffing level.
- 4. The total number of staff was multiplied by the individual county's actual FFH unit cost.

In addition, a total of \$21,000 GF is allocated to those counties with licensing activities associated with the Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of 2006. This premise reflects the costs associated with child abuse and neglect registries and responding to

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other states' requests for underlying information about child abuse and neglect reports in California. Funds were allocated on a percent to total basis according to calendar year 2015 average monthly FFH new license caseload.

For those counties that do not participate in the licensing program, the FFH Recruitment allocation funds are distributed based on each county's Family Reunification and Permanent Placement average monthly caseload, using the most recent 12 months caseload data and the number of children under 18 years of age from the United States Census Bureau.

As a reminder, the Resource Family Approval (RFA) Program replaces the existing separate processes for licensing FFHs, approving relatives and non-relative extended family members and approving adoptive families. Therefore, a reduction for RFA activities that are now funded under a separate allocation was applied and distributed based on a percent to total of the FFH licensing allocation.

The FFH Licensing and Recruitment administrative costs, including staff development, are charged to Program Codes 155 (Licensing/Foster Family Home) and 156 (Foster Family Licensing, Non-Federal) on the County Expense Claim (CEC). State Use Only (SUO) code 192 is used for expenditures exceeding the GF CCL/FFH allocation, which will be shifted to county-only funding.

#### FCCH Licensing

Attachment II displays the total allocation of \$37,000 GF and reimbursement funding for FCCH Licensing activities. The amounts of \$22,000 GF for FCCH Licensing and Serious Incident Reporting and \$13,000 in reimbursement funds are distributed based on each county's staffing costs, determined as follows:

- Each county's average monthly FCCH caseload for calendar year 2015 as reported on the LIC 181 was divided by the workload standard of 257 facilities per FTE.
- 2. This resulted in the number of justified staff required to license this facility category.
- 3. A worker to supervisor ratio of 6.25:1 was applied to the justified staffing level.
- 4. Total staffing was then multiplied by the individual county's actual FCCH unit cost.

The FCCH Licensing administrative costs, including staff development, are charged to PC 157 (Licensing/Family Day Care) on the CEC. The SUO Codes 061 and 062 will be used to ensure that 100 percent of the reimbursement funds are expended before

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counties access their GF allocation. Expenditures exceeding the GF allocation will be shifted to county-only funding using SUO Code 153.

#### **RSO Check**

Attachment I and Attachment II display \$46,000 GF for FFH and \$2,000 GF for FCCH, respectively. The funds were allocated for the RSO Check based on a percent to statewide total using the calendar year 2015 average monthly caseload for annual checks and application registered sex offender checks.

This premise reflects the costs to minimize the risk of predictable and preventable harm to vulnerable children in out-of-home care by detecting the presence or residency of a RSO in the prospective and approved licensed facilities and/or in the prospective and approved Relative/Non Relative Extended Family Member's homes.

The FFH RSO costs are charged to PC 155 (Licensing/Foster Family Home) and FCCH RSO costs are charged to PC 157 (Licensing/Family Day Care) on the CEC.
