The purpose of this letter is to inform County Welfare Departments (CWDs) of a revised funding distribution for the California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) Housing Support Program (HSP) for Fiscal Year (FY) 2016-17.

Pursuant to the Budget Act of 2015, unspent CalWORKs HSP funds for FY 2015-16 were reappropriated to FY 2016-17. The California Department of Social Services (CDSS) estimates approximately \$1.4 million from FY 2015-16 will be reappropriated to FY 2016-17. This letter provides CWDs with a planning allocation for the estimated \$1.4 million in additional carry-over HSP funds available for FY 2016-17. The CDSS, in consultation with the County Welfare Directors Association has also determined that approximately \$1.2 million of the FY 2016-17 HSP allocation should be redistributed for FY 2016-17 in order to maximize overall statewide utilization of the HSP allocation.

The following attachment displays revised county specific planning allocations for FY 2016-17. The CDSS will release a final FY 2016-17 allocation after the final FY 2015-16 year-end closeout is complete.

The CWDs are reminded that receipt of the CalWORKs HSP allocation requires CWD Directors to ensure the following: in-person representatives for required HSP trainings and meetings, to provide HSP data as requested by the CDSS, to target spending on direct financial assistance at a rate of 70 percent or more of the HSP allocation and to

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target providing permanent housing assistance to a specified number of families, as indicated in the county plan for FY 2016-17. The target number of families to provide permanent housing assistance should be increased at a rate proportionate to any allocation increases. Counties should refer to the FY 2016-17 HSP Director Certification to confirm the target number of families for permanent housing and adjust their target accordingly. New certification letters will not be issued.
